Notes on the REDCap Template for Case Reporting

Once the REDCap project has been uploaded as a new project, the Record Home Page will look similar to that shown in Figure 1. There are four instruments included in the project:

- Tier 1 Cases This instrument includes fields for all suggested NAS variables for Tier 1 surveillance, not including toxicology results.
- Tier 1 Infant Tox This instrument captures information from the infant's toxicology lab report. This instrument needs to be set as a repeatable instrument in order to collect all toxicology reports for the infant in the event that more than one sample was tested.
- Tier 1 Maternal Tox This instrument captures information from the birthing person's toxicology lab report. This instrument needs to be set as a repeatable instrument in order to collect all toxicology reports for the birthing parent in the event that more than one sample was tested.
- Tier 2 Cases This instrument captures the minimal information required to account for a Tier 2 case of NAS.



Repeating Instruments



Both toxicology instruments must be designated as Repeating Instruments to enable more than one toxicology result to be entered for each case. To do this, navigate to the Project Setup tab and click the Modify button to the left of the "Repeating instruments" label as shown in the picture below and set the two toxicology instruments as repeatable.
